### LIFE'S REFLECTIONS

Lee Gentry Russell, the youngest of three sons, was born to the Reverend Ray Vester Russell and Bonnie (Morris) Russell on October 27, 1929 in Sullivan, Indiana. Both of his parents, and his brothers, Robert "Bob" Louis Russell, Sr. and Morris Ray Russell, preceded him in death.

Lee was reared in a rather structured, yet loving Christian household embraced with strict values and morals from a very early age. As a young child, Lee accepted Christ and attended Terre Haute Gospel Chapel. Although he was nurtured in this type of environment, his parents recognized that boys would be boys and needed outlets to grow into upstanding, well rounded adults. Lee's father, Ray Russell, introduced his sons to the joys and adventures of hunting and fishing which they thoroughly enjoyed and continued throughout their lives. In fact, Lee owned a very beautiful and powerful boat, which traveled various lakes around the country for fishing, water skiing, and other water sporting events. Reluctantly, he parted with his cherished boat this past summer due to his declining health.

Lee attended the public schools in Sullivan, Indiana, graduating from Sullivan High School in 1947. Lee was a very good student, a star football player, and was well known and liked by students and teachers alike.

Upon graduating from high school, Lee began his career in the funeral industry. He joined ventures with his older brother Bob, who by this time helped to establish the Green-Russell Funeral Home in Terre Haute, Indiana. Together, Lee and Bob established The Russell Funeral Home.

Lee took a short break from the funeral industry to serve his country in the US Army during the height of the Korean War (May 1951). He attended military leadership school at Fort Riley, Kansas and encountered combat in Korea as an infantryman. He was honorably discharged from military service in February 1953, having attained the rank of Sergeant (E-5).

Upon separation from the US Army, Lee continued his professional development by attending the Indiana College of Mortuary Science (ICMS) in Indianapolis and graduated at the top of his class in September 1955. Due to his academic standing and level of advanced technical skills in the art and science of embalming that he acquired later in his career, he was selected as an adjunct instructor of students at Southern Illinois University and Forrest Park College of Mortuary Science. Lee Russell was very proud and honored to work in the field of mortuary science and worked tirelessly to pass down the pride and honor that he felt to future morticians.

Upon graduation, he continued to work for a mortuary in Indianapolis doing specialized work for three morticians. His services were in such

high demand due to his works of art on severe trauma cases. While working in Indianapolis, he met and married Lewana Hill in 1955. From this union, two children were born; Ray Vincent and Leann Marie.

In 1960, Lee moved his family to East St. Louis, Illinois, accepting a position with Officer Funeral Home. He continued perfecting his skills and development as a director, manager, and master embalmer for 17 years. During his tenure at Officer Funeral Home, he met and married Dorothy J. Tharp who passed in 1990.

Having an entrepreneurial spirit, Russell partnered with Albert P. Ransom to establish Russell-Ransom Funeral Directors in East St. Louis in 1977. After several years, this business became Russell Memorial Chapel with Lee Russell as president and sole proprietor. Lee continued to manage the business and operations of Russell Memorial Chapel until 1991 when he began work in a more limited capacity. Due to his reduced involvement and exhaustion with the extreme cold weather in Illinois, Russell moved to Atlanta, Georgia in 2005 to be closer to his immediate family. He continued the activities he so loved, such as boating, fishing, and golfing in Atlanta to the extent that his health would permit.

Quietly and peacefully, with his son and daughter by his side, Lee G. Russell entered into eternal rest on Monday, January 13, 2014, 6:00 p.m. at his earthly home in Jonesboro, Georgia. His jovial personality and zest for life are admirable traits which will be direly missed by those left to mourn his passing: an adoring daughter, Leann Marie Russell (Darnell) Keepler, Jonesboro, Georgia; a caring son, Ray Vincent Russell, Atlanta, Georgia; a special godson, Lucius Walker; a daughter, Cathe (Kenneth) Allen, Seattle, Washington; a loving granddaughter, Taylor Leann Keepler, Jonesboro, Georgia; a grandson, Jarett Lee Russell, St. Louis, Missouri; a granddaughter, Kia-Rae Allen, Seattle, Washington; a very endeared friend, Ms. Elizabeth Russell, Terre Haute, Indiana; a dear friend, Ms. Ruth Clayborne, East St. Louis, Illinois; and numerous other relatives and friends, including the staff of Russell Memorial Chapel.
